used to + infinitive

Past habits:

I **used to** play basketball.

Past states:

They **used to** live in Los Angeles.

Examples:

My father **used to** do the washing-up.

Tom and Mike **used to** meet on Sundays.

"USED TO"

Negative form:

didn't use to + infinitive

She **didn't use to** read that magazine.

We **didn't use to** go dancing.

Did she use to listen to the radio? **Yes, she did.**

Did you use to take photographs? **No, I didn't.**

"-ing" adjectives → descriptions

boring
worrying
interesting
tiring
surprising

ADJECTIVES ENDING IN
"-ED" AND "-ING"

Examples:

This movie is very **boring**.

The news is **worrying**.

The journey was very **tiring**.

ADJECTIVES ENDING IN
"-ED" AND "-ING"

I am **bored** because this program is **boring**.

We are **worried** because our situation is **worrying**.

He is **surprised** because the result was **surprising**.

Other adjectives:

annoyed	annoying
embarrassed	embarrassing
frightened	frightening
excited	exciting
exhausted	exhausting


Tweet Break!

- The first President to greet people with a handshake was Thomas Jefferson. Before that, Presidents bowed.
- The California grizzly bear is the state's official animal. However, in 1953 when it was named, it had already become extinct. The last known California grizzly to have been seen was killed in 1922.
- July 4, 1776, is the "official" date when our country was born, but actually was not one country until 1788.
- Charles Lindbergh was not the first person to fly across the Atlantic. He was the first to make it alone. 2 Britains did it in 1919, and 2 weeks later U.S. Navy pilots did the same thing! What is amazing is that nobody remembers them!
- During the Civil War, more soldiers died of disease than they did from gunshots and fighting.
- The first motel was built in San Luis Obispo, California during the 1920's when the Motor Inn merged the two words, motor and hotel. It is still there today!
