some	body
any	one
every	thing
no	where

- body / -one ⇒ people
- thing ⇒ things
- where ⇒ places

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

Compounds of "some" ⇒ affirmative sentences

somebody, someone / something / somewhere

There's **somebody** / **someone** at the door.
I have **something** in my pocket.
She left her watch **somewhere**.

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

Compounds of "any" ⇒ { negative sentences
questions

anybody, anyone / anything / anywhere

Is there's **anybody** / **anyone** at home?
I don't have **anything**.
I can't find my wallet **anywhere**.

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

Compounds of "every" ⇒ { affirmative sentences
negative sentences
questions

everybody, everyone / everything / everywhere

Did **everybody** / **everyone** come to the party?
I didn't tell you **everything**.
There are people **everywhere**.

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

Compounds of "no" → affirmative sentences

nobody, no-one / nothing / nowhere

I saw **nothing** there = I didn't see **anything** there

Nobody / No-one came to the party.

Nowhere is safe.

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

Indefinite pronouns = he, she, it

Somebody **is** there.

Everybody **sleeps** at night.

There **isn't** anyone at home.
