[To come]

I **came across** the hall to go out.

They **come back** home after school.

She's **coming from** work.

I'd like to **come to** this place again.

I like **walking along** the 5th Avenue.

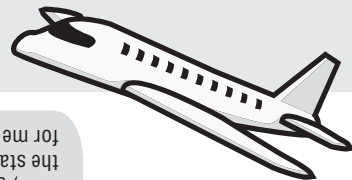
