You mustn't drive drunk.

#### can't

You can't smoke in this area.

You can't speak loud in a hospital.



# EXPRESSING CONTRAST: "BUT", "HOWEVER" AND "ALTHOUGH"

but

contrast with the previous idea or sentence

however

I don't speak French **but** English.
I don't speak French, **but** I speak English.
I don't speak French. **However**, I speak English.

### INTERMEDIATE

EXPRESSING CONTRAST: "BUT", "HOWEVER" AND "ALTHOUGH"

"Although" introduces a sentence that contrasts with another one.

**Although** it rained a lot, we enjoyed our vacation.

We got up early **although** we didn't have anything to do.


