To hope: you want something to happen.

I **hope** he does well tomorrow.

We **hope**to win the lottery.

To expect: to look forward to the probable occurrence or appearance of something or someone.

She **is expecting** a baby.

I **expect**him to come at six.

To wait (for): to remain or rest in expectation.

My mother **is waiting**for me.

Are you waitingfor the bus?

So + auxiliary (affirmative) + subject

She is Spanish. **So am I.**

They can speak Arabic. **So can he.**

My sister likes traveling. **So do I.**

I usually read the newspaper. **So does my mother.**

Brenda went to school by bus. **So did we.**

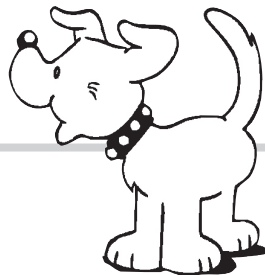
