a) JUST

- Affirmative sentences and questions.
- Action completed in the very recent past.
- Position: before the past participle.

I have just arrived. Have you just phoned her?



THE PAST PERFECT WITH "JUST", "YET" AND "ALREADY"

b) YET

- Negative sentences and questions.
- Expecting something to happen.
- Position: at the end of the sentence.

They haven't done their homework yet. Has he finished it **vet**?



THE PAST PERFECT WITH "JUST", "YET" AND "ALREADY"

c) ALREADY

- Affirmative sentences and questions.
- Sooner than expected.
- Position: before the past participle / at the end of the sentence.


She has **already** read that book. Have you already seen him?

THE PAST PERFECT WITH "JUST", "YET" AND "ALREADY"

In American English:

I have just bought a car. I just bought a car.



He has already washed the dishes. He already washed the dishes.





1) To need I need some butter.		
need + to + infinitive		
They need to study harder.		



ADVANCED EXPRESSING NECESSITY

2) Have to + infinitive must + infinitive

She'll **have to borrow** some money.

I must see the doctor soon.

ADVANCED

EXPRESSING NECESSITY

Lack of necessity:

don't / doesn't have to + infinitive

It's Sunday. I don't have to get up early.
