ADVANCED TIME CLAUSES when as soon as before after until while

ADVANCED TIME CLAUSES Examples: I'll pay you back **as soon as** I get some money. I want to see her **before** she leaves. I'll phone you **after** I get home.



2nd TYPE ADVANCED OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

It is possible but very unlikely that the condition will be fulfilled.

> If + subject + verb (past) ..., subject + verb (conditional) ...

2nd TYPE ADVANCED OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

I won't speak to her **until** she says sorry.

They will read a lot of books while they are on vacation.

Examples:

If I won some money, I would travel around the world.

I wouldn't do it if I didn't like it






When the verb "to be" is used in the condition, the form "were" is used for all persons.
