TIME CLAUSES

Examples:

I'll pay you back **as soon as** I get some money.

I want to see her **before** she leaves.

I'll phone you **after** I get home.

I won't speak to her **until** she says sorry.

They will read a lot of books **while** they are on vacation.

2nd TYPE
OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

It is possible but very unlikely that the condition will be fulfilled.

If + subject + **verb (past) ...**,
subject + **verb (conditional) ...**

2nd TYPE
OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

Examples:

If I **won** some money, I **would travel** around the world.

I **wouldn't do it** if I **didn't** like it

What **would** you **do** if you **saw** someone shoplifting?

2nd TYPE OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

When the verb "to be" is used in the condition, the form "**were**" is used for all persons.

If I **were** you, I wouldn't do it.

2nd TYPE OF CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

would →
 could
 might

We **couldn't** buy it if we didn't have any money.

If I saved some money I **might** be able to buy a computer.
