Contraction:

had = 'd

You'd written a novel.

She'd stolen a purse.

had = 'd (+ past participle) would = 'd (+ infinitive) I'd seen that picture. (had) I'd see that picture. (would)

Negative sentences:

hadn't (had not) + past participle

We **hadn't forgotten** to buy some food.


